

## Catch-up Covid Premium - Spending plan 2020/21

The Covid Catch Up funding will be paid across 2 financial years. We will receive £46.67 per student (based on the October 19 census of 1025 students) which will be paid this financial year (so before March 21). Then we will receive £33.33 per student (based on October 2020 census) in the 2021/22 financial year. In total, we expect to receive just over £80,000
